Our public washrooms were closed as of March 16 until further notice. Our office is not open to the public but we will speak to you through phone, email or at a safe distance outdoors. We are practicing isolation and physical distancing for our safety and yours.

LEASE TENANTS & THEIR GUESTS

We are temporarily closing the park to all visitors / guests until further notice. We will re- access on May 1, 2020. We are currently allowing Lease holder access. In the case of lots with secondary family members we will allow alternating weekends. IE: Mom and Dad come one weekend and Son and daughter in law come on a different weekend. All tenants must stay on their lot and practice physical distancing from other tenants. No person(s) will be allowed to enter property that is showing symptoms of illness. There will be no lease for sale viewings allowed during this time.

PUBLIC RESERVATION AREAS:

We are not open to public camping at this time. We are accepting camping reservation for the season but reserve the right to cancel reservations as Covid 19 conditions change. These cancellations will be with sufficient notice and be done through phone or email. We still hope to have a camping season if Covid 19 conditions improve and government restrictions are lifted. Please understand that these measures are to prevent community spread as in your community to our community and vice versa. We ask that you contact us during business hours with any questions.

"We just don't know if the infection curve will flatten, or if secondary breakouts will occur. We will have to make these important decisions as new information comes out. We are watching the Alberta Provincial campground sites/information as a guideline. We fully intend to cooperate with Municipal and Provincial Governments orders/recommendations as we move forward from here. The best thing right now is for people to be still, remain in their own home as that the short term inconveniences will outweigh the long-term consequences.
